#### 2. Declarations of interest

## 3. Minutes - to approve and sign the minutes of 4th December 2024 meeting

The minutes were proposed by Cllr Salamons, seconded by Cllr Hamilton and were unanimously **AGREED** to be a true and accurate record. They were duly signed by the Chair.

4. Public Question time from residents of Birdham in accordance with Standing Orders 1d –

## 5. To receive reports from CDC members for Birdham

- i. Cllr Hamilton had attended the Cabinet meeting yesterday and before the start of the meeting the CEO Diane Shepherd had talked about Devolution. The WSCC meeting to decide whether to submit an expression of interest was to be held tomorrow at 10.30am. There will be a new footprint for Sussex, and the WSCC elections would be put off for a year.
- ii. The Infrastructure Business plan was discussed. The police have asked for funds to install more cameras around Chichester district principally numberplate recognition cameras.
- iii. The strategy for the homeless was reviewed
- iv. There will be training on the Biodiversity Net Gain and monitoring charges for 30 years will be asked for up front for new developments.

## The chair moved item 10 to here - Report from WSCC member for Birdham

- i. Cllr Montyn referred back to Cllr Hamilton's report on police cameras. He said one was designated for the Witterings road but the actual location is not yet known.
- ii. Cllr Montyn had sent updates on the Almodington sewage leak to the clerk. Two thousand residents were affected by the sewage pipe breakage. Tankers were pumping for 4/5 hours per day. Cllr Montyn will have his usual meeting with Southern Water on 30<sup>th</sup> Jan and will make it clear to them that this kind of disruption cannot happen again. The pipe is two miles long and if it has broken in one place it may happen in another what will they do to ensure that it does not happen again?
  - Cllr Montyn asked residents to let him know before the end of the month of any recurrent issues that they are suffering so that he can bring them to the attention of SW.

#### iii. Devolution

Cllr Montyn had sent several documents to the clerk which she will circulate tomorrow. As previously stated, the expression of interest must be registered by 10<sup>th</sup> January 2025 (Friday).

The government wished to see all local upper-tier authorities team together with others. Unitary authorities will be formed by grouping local councils together. If the Council does not choose to do it, it will be forced upon it at a later date.

WSCC, East Sussex and Brighton and Hove are proposing to submit together (population of about 1.7 million). Between times the work still needs to be done by the District Councils, but ultimately they will fall away.

The new authorities will be responsible for Strategic Planning, Transport (rail and road) and other portfolios will be devolved on them.

New Unitary Councils will be formed at a local level.

WSCC has drafted a letter expressing its interest and tomorrow at the Cabinet meeting they will ask members to support it.

The government will issue a public consultation later this month.
